From the Pastor's Desk

Mercy Sunday in the Year of Mercy

This day is known by a number of names. It is called the Second Sunday of Easter. In other words, it is the second of eight Sundays in the Easter season. The first is Easter itself and the last is Pentecost. So that's one name. It is also called Low Sunday, a reference to the fact that is in the last day in the octave (an eight-day period) of Easter. Aren't church words great? Finally, in recent years it has also been called Divine Mercy Sunday. St. John Paul II placed this feast on the Church's calendar in the year 2000 as a tribute to Jesus' apparitions to Sr. Faustina, a Polish nun who was recently canonized a saint. Jesus appeared to Sr. Faustina as the embodiment of Divine Mercy. She related not only what she heard but also what she saw. There is a picture of the apparition, Jesus, the Divine Mercy, in the sanctuary. Beneath the picture are the words, "Jesus I trust in you."

What better time to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday that in this Jubilee Year of Mercy. We celebrate God's saving mercy for each of us even as we remind ourselves of the need to hand that mercy on to others. What I have freely received, I must freely give away.

As you may know, the newest committee to be formed here in St. Patrick's is the Social Action Committee. This committee will be coordinating efforts to identify folks with ongoing or transient needs so that these people can be helped. Their needs might include rides to markets, doctors, or church, etc. Perhaps they are homebound and would want the Eucharist brought to them. Perhaps it's a family that is in need because of illness or injury. Perhaps we can help. Whether it's a Spiritual Work of Mercy, or a Corporal one, the parish should be thought of as a resource, just as each individual Christian and disciple of Jesus should be so regarded.

It's not too early in the Committee's existence for us to engage all of our parishioners with this thought: if you know of anyone who is in need of the above services because they are not presently being tended to, or if you yourself have a particular skill that you would like to put at the service of the Committee, just let us know. Mercy Sunday in the Year of Mercy: a good time to think about these things.

Words of Pope Francis

THE MYSTERY OF MERCY

"We need constantly to contemplate the mystery of mercy. It is a wellspring of joy, serenity and peace. Our salvation depends on it. Mercy: the word reveals the very mystery of the most Holy Trinity. Mercy: the ultimate and supreme act by which God comes to meet us. Mercy: the fundamental law that dwells in the heart of every person who looks sincerely into the eyes of his brothers and sisters on the path of life. Mercy: the bridge that connects God and us, opening our hearts to a hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness. Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy, which might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith. Mercy has become living and visible in Jesus of Nazareth, reaching its culmination in him."

1. To instruct the ignorant
2. To counsel the doubtful
3. To admonish the sinner
4. To comfort the sorrowful
5. To forgive injuries
6. To bear wrongs patiently
7. To pray for the living & the dead

CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

1. To feed the hungry
2. To give drink to the thirsty
3. To clothe the naked
4. To shelter the homeless
5. To visit the sick
6. To visit the imprisoned
7. To bury the dead.

All of these are the works of mercy. They pervade every part of our lives. The person who is involved in them is a true child of God, a wonderful person to know and be around. Mercy beckons us every day!
