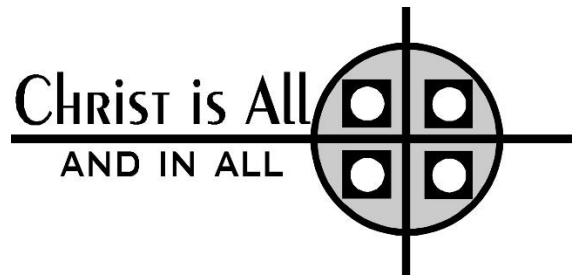

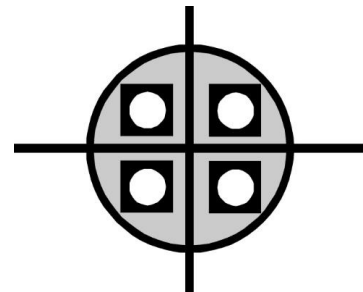

## **Pilgrimage to New York**

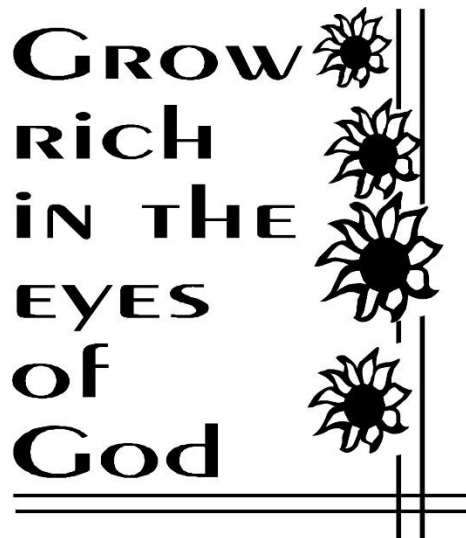

## **Words of Pope Francis**

### **YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU**

“A heart troubled by the desire for possessions is a heart full of desire for possessions, but empty of God. That is why Jesus frequently warned the rich, because they greatly risk placing their security in this world's goods, because final security is in God. In a heart possessed by wealth, there isn't much room for faith: everything is involved with wealth, If we accumulate not for ourselves alone but for the service of others, God's providence is made visible. If, however, one accumulates only for oneself, what will happen when one is called by God? No one can take his riches with him, because the shroud has no pockets! It is better to share for we can take with us to heaven only what we have shared with others.”



## **New York Catholic Bible School Program**

Beginning Monday, Sept. 12, 2016, the New York Catholic Bible School Program, sponsored by the Archdiocesan Catechetical Office, will be holding classes on Monday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 pm, at the Church of St. Denis, 604 Beekman Road, Hopewell Junction, N.Y.

The New York Catholic Bible School exists because there is joy and hope in the Bible! Being grounded in our beliefs leads us to a deeper relationship with God and an evolving sense of life's meaning. Intense study of the Bible brings us to life-changing personal growth in spirituality and service. This program is for adults who are seeking “something more” in their spiritual journey, and who are willing to commit to two years of study with an option to complete the full four-year program.

No particular educational background is required. Tuition is \$150 per trimester with a \$35 non-refundable registration fee. **Registration is a must and is done through the New York Catholic Bible School website.**

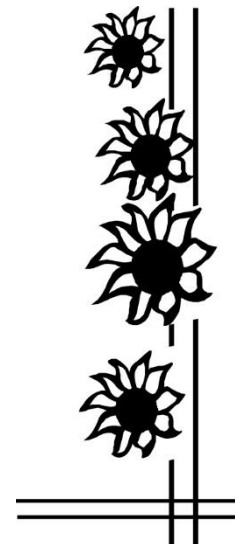

**MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE PLAN APPEAL**  
**ST. PATRICK FATHERS**

Our church is a missionary church. From the beginning, it has obeyed Christ's command to go out and preach the gospel to everyone in the world. This missionary work involves recruiting missionaries, training and equipping them for their task – mainlining them and supporting the new, young churches until they are established.

The Society for the Propagation of the Faith is established in every diocese to organize support for the missions. Each year, it appeals for funds on Mission Sunday. Also, every year, it brings to each parish one of the groups working in the missions to speak about their particular work.

This year, the ST. PATRICK FATHERS, who work in Africa, Brazil and Grenada, have been assigned to speak at our parish. We will have a second collection to support their work.

ST. PATRICK'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY (also known as ST. PATRICK FATHERS) was formally established on March 17, 1932. The Society was founded by Irish diocesan priests who initially had gone to work on a temporary basis in Nigeria, West Africa, but who later wished to dedicate their lives fully to the missions. Later as the new missionary society grew, more work was undertaken, not only in Nigeria but also in Kenya (1951), Brazil (1962), Malawi (1970), Grenada (1970), Zambia (1973), Sudan (1983), Zimbabwe (1989), Cameroon (1989) and Homelands of South Africa (1989).

There are now 291 priests in the Society, of which 21 are newly-ordained African priests. After a drop in vocations in recent years, there are now more than 50 students and two deacons preparing for the priesthood information centers in Nigeria, Kenya and South Africa.

Most of the people among whom we work are extremely poor, and we have no means of training our seminarians and supporting our priests in their work other than the donations we receive.

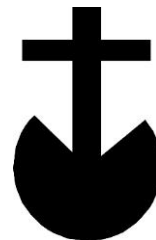
