# From the Pastor's Desk

## General Instruction of the Roman Missal – Conclusion

For more than five weeks, we have been reviewing the Preamble of the *General Instruction to the Roman Missal*, commonly called the GIRM. The reason for this admittedly sometimes-dry quote was to prepare some of you to be able to respond positively to my request to set up a Worship Committee.

Ideally, a Worship Committee would be comprised of three distinct types of people: the Clergy, the leaders of the different Liturgical Ministries (Altar Servers, Children's Masses, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Readers, Music and Ushers) and some really interested parishioners.

Here at St. Patrick's that means The Clergy: Fr. Joe Bisignano, Fr. Joseph Boateng and Deacon Lou Santore (3); The Liturgical Ministries as mentioned above (6); and Interested Parishioners (6).

This Worship Committee would begin by reviewing the whole GIRM that includes chapters on: The Importance and Dignity of the Celebration of the Eucharist; The Structure of the Mass, Its Elements and Its Parts; Duties and Ministries in the Mass; The Different Forms of Celebrating Mass; The Arrangement and Ornamentation of Churches for the Celebration of the Eucharist; The Requisites for the Celebration of Mass; The Choice of the Mass and Its Parts; Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions and Masses for the Dead; and Adaptions With the Competence of Bishops and Bishop's Conferences.

The six members representing the parish as a whole will be determined on a first-come basis. The Monday following the publication of this note (September 12<sup>th</sup>) will begin the calling-in phase which will continue until we have six people signed up.

This committee will meet on the first Monday of each month from 7:00pm until 9:00pm in the Cenacle Meeting Room. For the first few months I will chair this committee until all the members have a better idea of all that it entails and then a chairperson will be chosen. The main focus of this committee is to look at how we celebrate the Sacraments of the Church in light of what the Church says we should be doing.
