From the Pastor's Desk

My vacation in Italy was terrific! Two nights in Venice, two nights in the Veneto, two nights in Verona, two nights in Norcia, and three nights in Rome. Liturgical highlights included celebrating Mass at the Shrine of Saint Anthony in Padua, the Cathedral in Verona, at the lower level where Saints Benedict and Scholastica were baptized in Norcia, and a Special Mass celebrated by His Eminence, Edwin Cardinal O'Brien at the tomb of Saint Peter in the Vatican.

I returned to the United States on Sunday the 16th and on Monday I drove to Spring Lake, NJ where the Archdiocese holds yearly workshops for Pastors. I attended the presentations on the financial situation of the Archdiocese, the new Rite of Marriage, and a whole day on how to improve my homilies. On Wednesday Cardinal Dolan celebrated Mass. After lunch he talked about seven points he wanted to cover and then after a short break he took questions from his pastors. Once again, I thought the presentations were OK but I always get more out of the conversations with 86 other pastors on what is working for them and what is not.

I want to take this opportunity to publicly thank Fr. Joseph for all that he did during my three weeks away. May the Lord continue to bless him for his generous spirit.

There is a public ritual called the "Installation of a Pastor" that takes place during the celebration of a Mass. Usually the "Dean" installs new pastors but since Msgr. Thomson retired the Cardinal has not yet appointed a new Dean. Therefore, I have asked Bishop Dominick Lagonegro to install me which he has graciously consented to do. He has chosen to install me on November 12th at the 5:30pm Mass. I hope that many of the parishioners will choose to participate in this celebration and then will join us for a catered dinner after the Mass in a place to be determined. It would be helpful if you let the office know how many will be joining us for the dinner.

Words of Pope Francis

"Let us receive the special grace of this moment. We pause in reverent silence before this empty tomb in order to rediscover the grandeur of our Christian vocation: we are men and women of resurrection, and not of death. From this place we learn how to live our lives, the trials of our Churches and of the whole world, in the light of Easter morning. Every injury, every one of our pains and sorrows, has been borne on the shoulders of the Good Shepherd who offered himself in sacrifice and thereby opened the way to eternal life. His open wounds are the cleft through which the torrent of his mercy is poured out upon the world. Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of the basis of our hope! Let us not deprive the world of the joyful message of the resurrection! And let us not be deaf to the powerful summons to unity which rings out from this very place, in the words of the One who, risen from the dead, calls all of us "my brothers" (cf. *Mt 28:10; Jn 20:17*)."

is a Holy Day of Obligation.

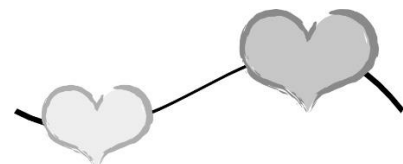
