From the Pastor's Desk

During this past week the Church celebrated the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration Of All The Faithful Departed (All Souls). These dual celebrations naturally cause us to think about our own mortality and the inevitability of our own deaths, unless, of course, the Parousia (Jesus' coming in glory at the end of the world) happens before we die.

For a Roman Catholic, in addition to the prayers one can say for the sick and dying, **the last sacrament is Holy Communion in the form of Viaticum**. If a priest were available, he would hear the person's confession, give the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, and give Holy Communion. Only a priest can hear a confession or give the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. However, a deacon, or a lay person, who is designated as a Minister of Holy Communion by his/her pastor in accordance with the regulations of the local bishop, Timothy Cardinal Dolan, the Archbishop of New York, can give Holy Communion to the dying.

Canon 911 Section 1: The duty and right to bring the Blessed Sacrament to the sick as Viaticum belongs to the parish priest.

Section 2: In a case of necessity, or with the permission at least presumed of the parish priest, who must subsequently be notified, a minister of Holy Communion may do this.

Canon 921 §1. The Christian faithful who are in danger of death from any cause are to be nourished by Holy Communion in the form of Viaticum.

§2. Even if they have been nourished by Holy Communion on the same day, however, those in danger of death are strongly urged to receive Communion again as Viaticum.

§3. While the danger of death lasts, it is recommended that Holy Communion as Viaticum be administered often, but on separate days.

Canon 922 Holy Viaticum for the sick is not to be delayed too long; those who have the care of souls are to be zealous and vigilant that the sick are nourished by Viaticum while fully conscious.

Words of Pope Francis

"But we know one thing: nothing is impossible for God's mercy! Even the most tangled knots are loosened by his grace. And Mary, whose 'yes' opened the door for God to undo the knot of the ancient disobedience, is the Mother who patiently and lovingly brings us to God, so that he can untangle the knots of our soul by his fatherly mercy. We all have some of these knots and we can ask in our heart of hearts: What are the knots in my life? 'Father, my knots cannot be undone!' It is a mistake to say anything of the sort! She, as a woman of faith, will surely tell you: 'Get up, go to the Lord: he understands you'. And she leads us by the hand as a Mother, our Mother, to the embrace of our Father, the Father of mercies."

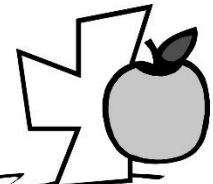
Parish Community Service Help

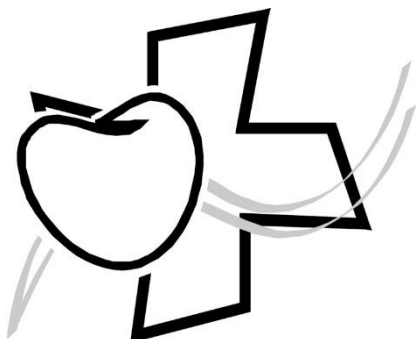
