From the Pastor's Desk

Catholic Schools Week 2017

Next Sunday, January 29th, is the annual Catholic Schools Week in the United States. Here in the Archdiocese of New York the theme is "Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service."

As you may know our own St. Patrick's School here in Bedford is one of four Regional schools in the Northern Westchester/Putnam Deanery. The others are in Yorktown Heights, Shrub Oak and Cortlandt Manor. These four schools are run by a Board of Pastors and Laity, assisted by the Archdiocese's Department of Education. Presently I serve on the Board and I am the Chairperson of the "Catholic Identity Committee."

Here at St. Patrick's Regional School our Principal Mrs. Sharyn O'Leary and her fine faculty and staff have been able to maintain a school that is able to boast of the students' superior testing scores. As the chairperson of the Catholic Identity Committee I am even more proud and excited about the vision of our Catholic faith and its values that are all in focus at St. Patrick's School. Whenever I enter the School I feel the presence of God because the Holy Spirit is alive and active in each and every person involved whether they be the students, faculty, staff, and every parent and volunteer who help make the school what it is. I truly believe that a Catholic grammar school is the best way to hand on our faith to the next generation.

This coming Sunday, January 29th there is an Open House at the school from 1:00pm to 3:00pm. You can see what this school is all about, and meet teachers, administrators, parents and students. There is also the possibility of touring the school on Tuesday, January 31st from 9-11am.

High Altar Candles

You may have noticed that toward the end of Advent and during the Christmas season we were able to light the six candles that stand near our Tabernacle. I have been told that it has been many, many years since that has been done. The fix was only temporary and now they are off the property so that when they return they will be able to be burning for all Masses on Feasts and Solemnities. The two by the Sacrificial Altar will be lit for every Mass but in keeping the liturgical concept of "Progressive Solemnity" the six high candles on the Blessed Sacrament Altar will be lit on all Feasts and Solemnities.

"Evangelizing the poor is Jesus' mission, the Church's mission, and also the mission of every person baptized in the Church. Being a Christian is the same thing as being a missionary. Proclaiming the Gospel with one's word, and even before, with one's life, is the primary aim of the Christian community and of each of its members. But what does it mean to evangelize the poor? It means first of all drawing close to them, having the joy of serving them, of freeing them from their oppression, and all of this in the name of and with the Spirit of Christ, because he is the gospel of God, the mercy of God, the liberation of God, the One who became poor so as to enrich us with his poverty."

RALLY FOR LIFE


The <u>March for Life</u> in Washington, DC will be on Friday, January 27, 2017.




In conjunction with the March in Washington, St. Patrick's will have an hour of Exposition and Adoration following the 9am Mass on Friday, January 27th.
