FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Last week our parish in union with William Dym and his living relatives, suffered through the sudden and violent deaths of three members of our local community. The outpouring of grief and support was deeply felt and our Church, filled way beyond capacity, was uplifting as any Funeral Mass could be. Will and his relatives were heroic in their suffering, the prayers and readings were soothing, Fr. Joseph's homily gave voice to our faith in God's love and mercy and those who wished received Holy Communion which is the 'bread of ever lasting life'. William's eulogy spoke of his love for his father, his sister, and his mother; and a Rabbi said the traditional Jewish prayer for the dead. Putting all this together, I came away with a song in my heart, praising God for His infinite goodness.

Within hours that had ended. On one side, complaints were raised about the fact that Steven, who was Jewish was given a Christian Funeral. Others complained that although Loretta's and Caroline's coffins were covered with a White Funeral Pall, Steven's was not. And even mentioned on a TV News station, it was stated negatively that the women's coffins were sprinkled with Holy Water but Steven's was not.

Here is what went through our minds. Steven had allowed his children to be raised Catholic. It meant a lot to the family that all three be together for the funeral. So, the unusual decision was made to have Steven's body with his wife and daughter. The absence of a funeral pall and our not sprinkling with Holy Water was a mark of respect for Steven's decision to remain Jewish. The white funeral pall symbolizes the white garment at Baptism as does the sprinkling of Holy Water. It was in no way anything other than a sign of respect for Steven's love for the religion in which he was raised. If this offends anyone's sensibilities I am truly sorry but I believe we did what was right, good, and merciful.

In the words of the Collect:

Lord, our God,
you are always faithful and quick to show mercy.

Our brother Steven, and our sisters Loretta and Caroline,
were suddenly and violently taken from us. Come swiftly to their aid,
have mercy on them,
comfort their family and friends
by the power and protection of the cross.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen
