## **IMITATING GOD'S COMPASSION**

Many people in our society live for altruism. They have chosen to use their energies and skills in the service of those most in need. They include many people whose lives are unsung songs of heroism, rarely if ever acknowledged -- those who sit with the sick and the dying, care for the elderly and infirm, staff the charity shops or man the lifeboat crews and mountain rescue teams, help the marginalized find their way through the welfare labyrinth or teach newly arrived immigrants our language so that they can function in society. They all are living from a source of compassion, and not primarily from a desire for personal gain. Indeed, to our shame, we acknowledge that many such people offer their services unpaid.
