FROM THE PASTOR'S **DESK**

This is the continuation of last week's submission of From The Pastor's Desk.

Concrete Time: Object of Experience

We cannot ignore the great "clocks" of the sun and the moon. They determine and measure night and day, the seasons, and, among other cycles, the year. It is possible to be content with this and take into account only their regular movement. In this perspective, time is a neutral value. In spite of variations (mostly minor or accidental) that can change the seasons from one year to the next time is characterized by the cyclical regularity that brings about monotony, or even the jaded boredom of which Ecclesiastes speaks:

One generation passes and another comes,
but the world forever stays.
The sun rises and the sun goes down;
Then it presses on to the place where it rises.
Blowing now toward the south, then toward the north,
The wind turns again and again, resuming its rounds.
All rivers go to the sea,
Yet never does the sea become full.
To the place where they go,
The rivers keep on going.

What has been, that will be; what has been done, that will be done. Nothing is new under the sun. Even the thing of which we say, "See, this is new!" has already existed in the ages that preceded us.
(Eccl 1:4-7,9-10)

It is true that we are not free simply to do anything at any moment. "Each thing in its time." Nature sets its rhythms; times of sowing, of reaping and harvests, etc.; time to rest in the field and time to bring in the cattle, etc. This regularity can, in itself, be perceived as constraining and monotonous. But this way of

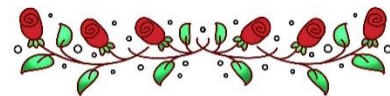
looking at time is concrete. It takes its historical content into consideration and is not concerned with the philosophical question of its nature. thus is it dealt with in the Bible. It calls Kairos "favorable time" or "opportune moment", what the Greeks would simply call chronos, i.e., abstract duration, mathematically measurable.

MORE ATTENTIVE LIVING

Paul's letter to the Thessalonians calls us to be aware of the times in which we live so that each day we do what God wants and not just what we want. Such attentiveness prepares us for the "thief in the night" that might come and, if we're not awake, disturb us out of our complacency and thrust us into darkness. That was what the Master in the Matthean parable recommended when he was generous. He praised those who multiplied their talents and, thus, gave them something to share with others. That is the same way the "woman of worth" in the first reading acted so that the "work of her hands" could be a source of praise. Do not bury what is valuable but use it wisely.
