FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

A Blessed and Joyful Easter! In the East there is a traditional greeting during the Easter Season: He is Risen! And the response; Indeed, He is truly Risen!

First, let me thank everyone who prayed for my recovery. Your prayers, cards of encouragement, and those who lived the Corporal Works of Mercy by visiting the sick especially while I was in the hospital. The priests' residence in Riverdale is much stricter on visitation since it is primarily the retirement home for our elderly priests but they do reserve a few beds for postoperative recuperation. It is not a rehabilitation facility but they do have a nurse on duty and they bring in the Visiting Nurse Service and Physical Therapy as needed. So again, thank you and may God bless you for your kindness.

Some have indicated an interest in knowing what happened. On Sunday, March 11th, I miss-stepped walking down the rectory staircase. When I put pressure on my right foot there was a terrible jolt of pain but I got in my car and did the things that I had planned. The pain grew worse and I asked Fr. Joseph to do both Masses that Monday morning which he graciously did. I stayed off the leg for that day and Tuesday returned to my regular schedule. Whenever the pain got bad I would just raise my leg for a while and things got better. Fast forward to Palm Sunday and late that night the pain got substantially worse. I stood to lead Morning Prayer but could not celebrate Mass. At about 11:30 I asked Fr. Joseph to drive me to the hospital and the scariest thing was that within an hour and a half I was on the operating table having a 9-inch hematoma removed from my thigh. Through the power of God working through the doctors and nurses, all went well and I was discharged exactly one week later on Easter Monday.

For a priest, especially a pastor, it is very hard to miss Holy Week. One of the priests who visited me mentioned that I was experiencing my own Good Friday in being separated from you. That changed my outlook and I stopped feeling sorry for myself and offered the pain and the separation to God for your benefit. I am not sure how that affected you but I felt spiritually connected to all that was going on here in the parish. A very special thank you to Fr. Joseph who was left with all the ceremonies that makeup Holy Week but he rose to the occasion and I am told that he did very well. Again, thank you Fr. Joseph for your love of God's people who make up the Parish of Saint Patrick in Bedford, and for bringing Christ to them during the various celebrations of the Paschal Mystery.
