WORDS OF INSPIRATION:

Created Side by Side

The Genesis story of Eve's creation from Adam's rib has several possible meanings. One interpretation sees the female as derivative and thus created for a secondary or supportive role: "As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands." Other scholars view Adam as word play on the Hebrew term *adamah*, meaning earth or ground. This theory holds that Adam represents a human whom God then divides into two genders so that Eve is created from Adam's side, suggesting partnership, not subservience. An old pop song touts the joy of traveling *Side by Side* and Galatians lauds the Lord's egalitarian Spirit: "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free person, male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."
